

About the Road Commission

The first meeting of the St. Clair County Board of Road Commissioners was held in Port Huron on Wednesday, June 18, 1913.

We are directed by a three-member policy setting board. One board member is appointed every other year to a six year term by the elected Board of County Commissioners. The Board also serves as the County Board of Public Works.

The Road Commission's largest source of revenue is the Michigan Transportation Fund from the State of Michigan derived from fuel taxes and license plate fees. Other major sources of revenue are a contract with the Michigan Department of Transportation to maintain State Highways within the County, contributions from the 23 townships and an annual appropriation from the County Board of Commissioners.

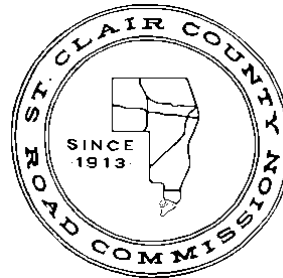
The organization is divided into four districts with the administration and main garage at the Central Service Center in St. Clair Township and three sub-garages located in Capac, Avoca and Marine City.

What is Adopt-A-County Road?

Adopt-A-County Road is a St. Clair County Road Commission program designed to bring our community together by beautifying St. Clair County's roadsides. Participating organizations and businesses "adopt" a section of the county's road system to clean and care for over a two-year period.

The program applies to all roads. The goal of the program is to make St. Clair County an attractive place to live and work. Adopt-A-County Road will enhance St. Clair County's appeal to business and industry in search of a place to call home.

Who is Eligible?

Just about any group of at least six people and three alternate participants is eligible.

It's a great opportunity for all types of organizations, including scout troops, college fraternities and sororities, activity and youth groups, small and large businesses, clubs, service organizations and senior citizen groups.

Crew members must be a minimum of 12 years old. Children between the ages of 12 to 15 must have adult supervision at a ratio of one adult for every three children.

Participants are asked to pick up litter a minimum of three times a year from the roadsides in their designated areas.

What Are The Benefits?

Besides the sense of pride each participating group will feel enhancing the appearance of St. Clair County, the name of each group will be identified on Adopt-A-County Road signs to be displayed near the designated roadside area.

Is There A Fee?

No fee is required to participate in the Adopt-A-County Road program. All participants are required to wear an orange or hunter's orange vest while working along the roadside. The Road Commission will supply safety vests.

Groups will also need to provide their own transportation to the adoption site. The Road Commission will provide bags for litter and pickup service for filled bags. Bags can be picked up at the main office of the St. Clair County Road Commission at 21 Airport Drive, St. Clair.

Safety

All Adopt-A-County Road participants are required to conduct a safety meeting once a year before the first pickup.

Once final adoption arrangements are made for each group or organization, the Road Commission will provide additional safety information, including rules, guidelines and videotape.

Where will my pickup site be located?

Requests for specific roadside areas will be handled on a first-come, first-served basis. Attempts will be made to match groups with their first choice or a segment that is closest to their community.
